Training will principally occur in Lincoln, and then positions will permanently be assigned to Omaha and Kearney.

The Essential Duties and Education/Experience requirements for the Examiner Trainee are as follows:

Participation in all areas of Safety and Soundness financial institution examinations, including the evaluation of capital adequacy, asset quality, management and oversight of a bank, earnings performance, liquidity, and sensitivity to market risk in order to assess the overall condition of a financial institution. In addition, the examiner trainee will assess information technology risk, compliance with laws, rules and regulations, statements of policy and compliance with outstanding enforcement actions.

Requires a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university with at least 24 semester hours in business administration, accounting, finance, marketing, or economics. Specific course requirements include a basic or introduction to accounting class and an intermediate or comparable accounting class. Preference will be given to majors such as Business Administration, Economics, Finance, Accounting, or Agricultural Economics. Work experience in a financial institution, other positions of trust, prior auditing or examining experience is desirable. Strong oral and written communication skills are essential. Good computer skills are required including proficiency with Microsoft Word and Excel. Must be able to meet deadlines, work with limited supervision, enjoy working with people, and be a team player. Travel is required, including some overnight travel. Must possess a valid Nebraska driver's license. Candidates interviewed must provide a college transcript at the time of the interview and will be required to take a short general mathematics, writing, and computer skills test.
